This fall [StartUP FIU](#) launched its first 14-week accelerator program, [The Empower Accelerator](#). The program received more than 300 applications for its initial two cohorts; each cohort is intended to accept no more than 20 companies. The program is state-funded and is at no-cost to participants. Additional accelerators, focused specifically on technology, food, and the arts, will come online in 2017. The 19 teams included students, alumni, staff and local residents with no affiliation to FIU. Members of this [inaugural cohort](#) were also on-site at the [Beacon Council's Connect & Grow initiative](#) to leverage the opportunity to spread the word about their nascent organizations and invite feedback on their developing products and brands.



The 2017 HULT Prize Competition

On December 9, 2016, [StartUP FIU](#) held its first [Hult Prize competition](#). The Hult Prize is an international competition boasting a \$1million prize, offered through The Hult Prize Foundation in partnership with Former US President Bill Clinton and the Clinton Global Initiative. The Foundation is a start-up accelerator for budding young social entrepreneurs emerging from the world's universities. For our part, StartUP FIU hosted a university-wide competition to select one team to represent FIU at regionals, as well as to win a spot in StartUP FIU's Empower Accelerator program. Each team was asked one question, "[Can we build sustainable, scalable social enterprises that restore the rights and dignity of 10 million refugees by 2022?](#)"



Pitch Day, Fall 2016

More than 300 attendees from both the FIU and South Florida community participated in FIU's first [Pitch Day](#), featuring 14 companies from the inaugural cohort of StartUP FIU's incubator program. Among the 30 venture capitalists and angel investors in the room, 9 were chosen to serve as panelists, and given the opportunity to ask questions to gain a deeper understanding of the companies. The investors expressed interest in follow-up conversations with several of the companies. The second cohort for The Empower Accelerator program will begin in January 2017.

Of the 10 teams that participated, **We-Women** stood out from the rest with a clear and feasible business plan that held the greatest promise of having a more immediate impact. This team's mission is to solve a problem faced by women refugees all around the world—the lack of feminine hygiene products. Their solution uses the leaves of banana trees to produce hypoallergenic and environmentally friendly menstrual pads, with an added twist—*buy a pad, give a pad*. Thus providing refugee women with a product that will allow them to go to school, work and be productive members of society. StartUP FIU will work with We-Women to prepare for the regional semi-final rounds of competition to be held in Boston on March 3, 2017. The overall winner of the 2017 HULT Prize will use the cash prize to help bring their idea to fruition.
